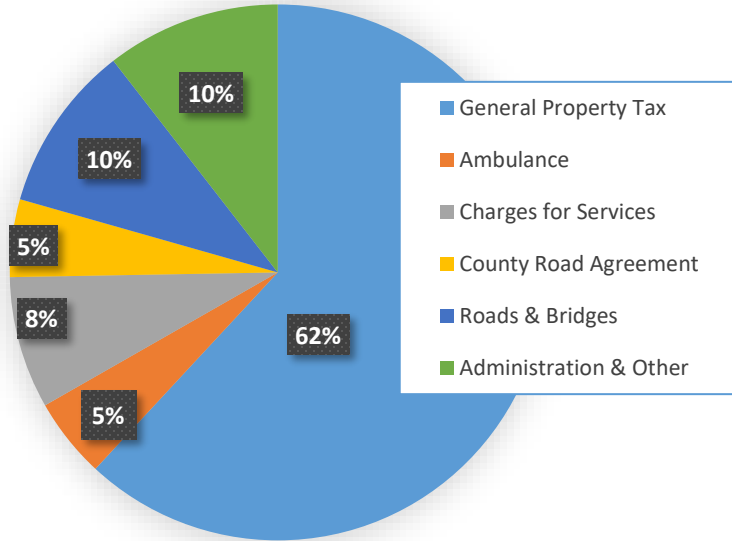


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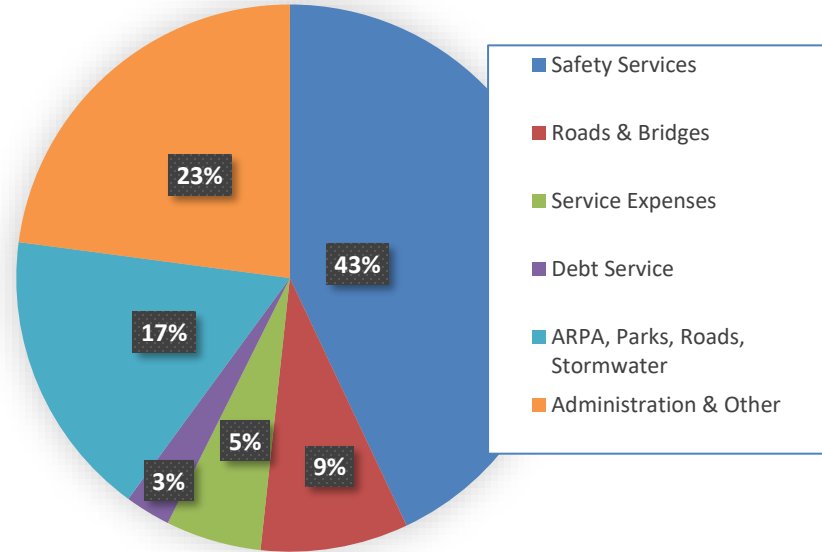
Center line miles of

- New website through CivicPlus



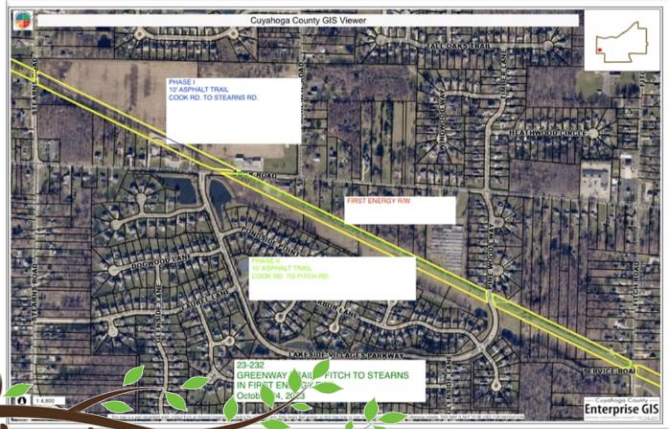
STREETSCAPE PLAN – TOWN CENTER

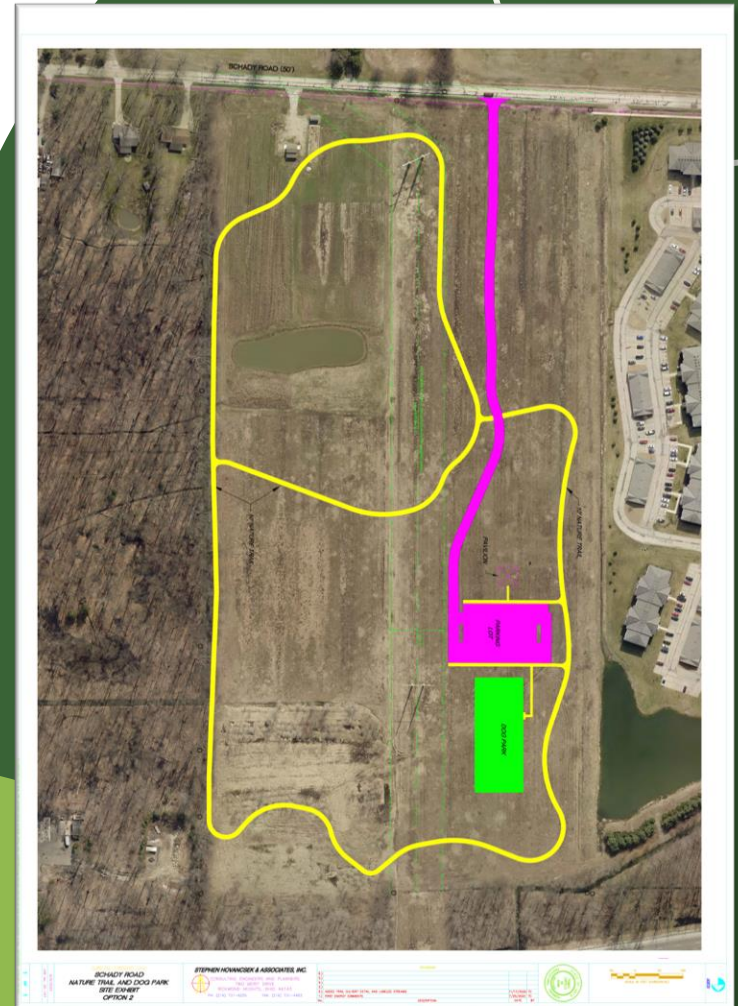


Received NOACA TLCI Implementation Grant for Stearns to Fitch Road Greenway Trail

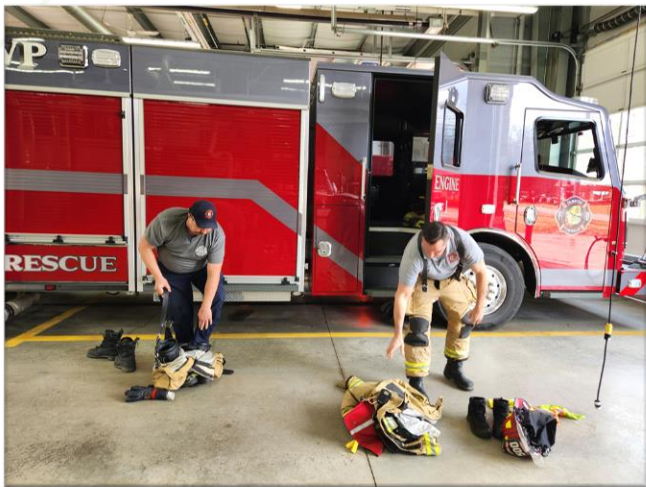

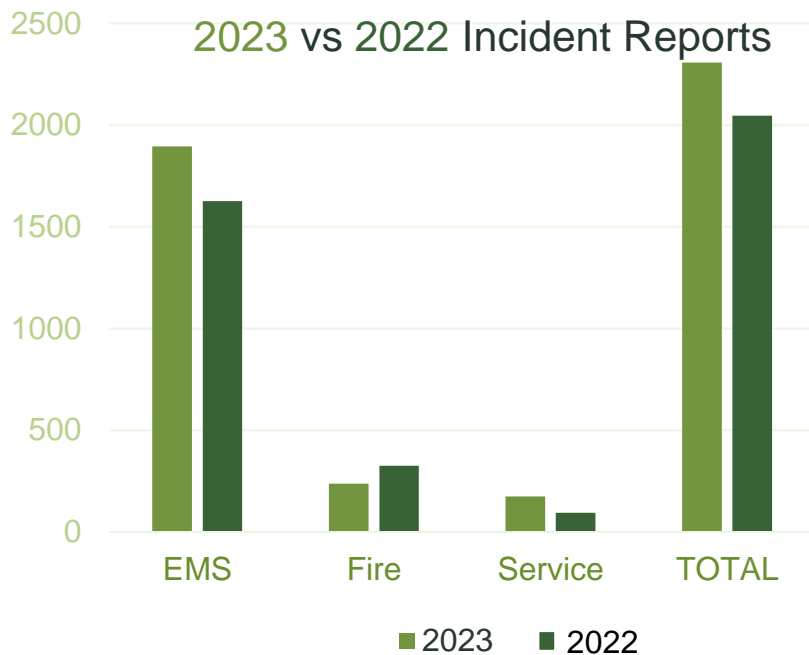

2023 Accomplishments

1. New Fire Engine
2. 3 new full-time Firefighter/Paramedics hired thanks to SAFER Grant
 - 5 men on duty for each shift
 - Staff had a total of 1,925 hours of training
3. AED/CPR Trainers
 - Now have 9 firefighters certified to train AED/CPR
 - Training has been given to all teachers in OFCSD
