DOG PARK OPENING



Rain did not dampen the enthusiasm of the residents and 4-legged friends who attended the ribbon-cutting for the Nature Trail & Dog Park on Schady Road. The fenced dog areas and trail hosted an array of dogs, children, and adults all enjoying the amenities provided. The Police demonstrated their drone and its capabilities and the Fire Department's Sparky was a welcome guest and photo op for many.

State Representative Bride Rose Sweeney presented a proclamation to honor the installation of the park; State Representative Tom Patton also attended. Sincere thanks to Cuyahoga County Council and Councilman Michael

Gallagher who advocated for the nature trail concept. The Township was awarded a \$480,000 grant for this project. State Senator Matt Dolan advocated for a \$300,000 grant through the Department of Natural Resources (ODNR).

The Township is in line to receive a \$250,000 grant for construction of a pavilion through the advocacy of Representative Sweeney. Additionally, Olmsted Township has been awarded \$150,000 from the Municipal Grant Program (CDBG Muni) for 2024, funded by federal Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds through Cuyahoga County.

Both the Nature Trail & Dog Park and the Usher Road Neighborhood Park and the Olmsted Trail are a result of the desire of residents for recreation opportunities expressed in the 2019 Comprehensive Plan. Commercial development that diversifies the tax base and recreation opportunities were the #1 & 2 issues important to respondents.



COMMEMORATIVE TREE & BENCH PROGRAM



The Township is also unveiling a new **Commemorative Tree and Bench Program** giving residents the opportunity to honor a loved one or commemorate a special achievement or event. Trees and benches will be placed in prominent and suitable locations at the trail and dog park or at Brentwood Play Park on Usher Road.

The lifetime sponsorship for each tree is \$400, which includes the purchase, planting and care of the tree by the Township Service Department. More than 15 native trees are available for selection. These trees will complement natural plantings that will attract the threatened bee and butterfly populations.



A bench sponsorship is \$500, which includes its purchase and maintenance. A customized plaque is available for both the tree and bench.


WHERE DO YOUR PROPERTY TAX DOLLARS GO? 2023 ALLOCATION

MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES




GREENWAY TRAIL

The Northeast Ohio Area-wide Coordinating Agency (NOACA) has awarded the Township a \$276,000 grant for Phase I/II of the Olmsted Greenway Connector project.

This project will utilize the existing utility corridor to install a 10 foot-wide multi-use path spanning about 1.25 miles from Fitch to Stearns Roads. This seg-

ment is part of the larger Cuyahoga County Greenway Trail and the adjacent Mill Stream Run Connector which will connect Olmsted Township, Olmsted Falls and Berea linking them to the Mill Stream Run Reservation and the Emerald Necklace Trail. The trail also impacts planned economic development at the corner of MacKenzie/ Cook Roads.

More than \$2.5 million has been allocated by NOACA through their Transportation for Livable Communities Initiative (TLCI) to support economic growth and connectivity within, between and among communities. The total cost of the Olmsted Connector is \$680,000. Additional grants (\$400,000) are being sought to complete this phased community project.



SENIOR TRANSPORTATION

The Trustees have approved a 6-month contract with Senior Transportation Connection (STC), to enhance access to essential services for Township residents. The agreement allows residents to use STC transport for medical appointments and grocery shopping within a 10-mile radius.

Residents will pay \$10 each way; the Township will pay \$30 each way. Total cost of round trip is \$80. A senior resident is limited to 2 round-trips per week.

To access the service, residents must complete a one-time registration form available at the Township Administration Building. Certain conditions apply. For more information call (440) 235-3099.

OLMSTED JEDD - RIGHTSITES PROGRAM

Eighty (80) acres of land at the heart of the Olmsted JEDD has been included in TeamNEO's RightSites program. This targeted program showcases the most competitive properties in the region prioritized and promoted as prime sites for investment and commercial development. This is a real boost for the Olmsted JEDD when commercial developers are seeking the right property for investment as it validates the site and Olmsted Township.
