

Residential Safety

- Lock your doors at night and every time you leave your house, even if just for a few minutes. Also, make sure your windows are locked and secure.
- Do not leave spare keys for your home under the doormat or a planter close to the door; leave them with a trusted family member or trusted neighbor.
- If you park your vehicle in the driveway, make sure the windows are up and the vehicle is locked. Also, if your keys have panic alarm, keep them on your nightstand in the event you need to activate the panic alarm during the night.
- Check to ensure that your exterior lights are operable; if they are not, replace them.
- Keep an eye on bushes or shrubbery around your home, keep them well trimmed as to prevent a would-be crook from hiding in them.
- Consider having lights on a timer that will come on even if you are not at the home.
- Keep grills, lawn mowers and other valuables locked in a garage or a shed when not in use. If the items must be left in the open, cover them with a tarp or secured to a stationary object.
- Document serial numbers on your valuables and keep them in a safe place.
