STEARNS ROAD PROJECT BEGINS



The long-awaited Cuyahoga County and Ohio Turnpike Commission Stearns Road Project between Bagley and Schady Roads has begun. The Cuyahoga County part of the project includes full-depth and full-width pavement reconstruction, pavement widening, upgraded traffic signals at the Bagley Road and Schady Road intersections, new curbs, walks, drainage, sanitary sewers, signage and pavement markings.

The Ohio Turnpike Commission is redecking the 34-year-old Stearns Road bridge over the turnpike. This includes increasing vehicular clearance and widening to accommodate 5-foot-wide sidewalks on each side of the bridge.

Some preparation work has already begun, such as surveying and moving utility poles. This next phase will involve complete closure of Stearns Road to traffic from April 3rd to August 29th and then one-way traffic heading south throughout the remainder of the project.

The Cuyahoga County/Ohio Turnpike Commission Stearns Road Project anticipated construction schedule is April 2023 through September 2024.

Our safety and service forces (Police, Fire, Public Service) have developed plans to continue to provide the services you have come to expect in a timely and efficient manner. Their input was invaluable in determining the south-bound traffic pattern.

Our website and Township Facebook page will be your best source of information on daily activity and updates throughout the project as well as daily traffic issues. Signage will be placed to mark the route.

It is important to note that Jennings Road will be resurfaced in June or July to accommodate school bus traffic. Because of delays related to the Ohio Turnpike Jennings Road Bridge, resurfacing could not be completed at the end of the project rebuild as anticipated. Traffic will be maintained throughout this resurfacing project.

This Cuyahoga County/Ohio Turnpike Stearns Road Project has been planned for some time; the rebuilding of the Turnpike bridge and complete road project are a much-needed improvement to this area of the Township. We ask your patience during this time. Allow a little extra time and exercise extreme caution in work zones and throughout the project area. The project construction is being administered by the Ohio Turnpike Commission. **Call (330) 410-3143 with complaints or concerns about this project.**

ROAD PROJECTS 2023

At the March 22nd Trustee meeting, the Board accepted bids for the 2023 road project work. The successful bidder is A & J Cement Contractors at \$918,042. In keeping with guidelines and priorities in the Township Road Maintenance Plan, the following Township roads will be rebuilt, repaired, and/or resurfaced. The first three projects are being funded by General Fund/Operating Levy money. The Board has allocated ARPA (American Rescue Plan funds) for the Avondale Court project.

- **Timber Lane** - about 900 ft. of pavement from Tall Oaks Trail to the Windwood Way entrance in the Breezewood/Greenbrooke neighborhood
- **Heatherwood Circle** - a cul-de-sac in the Breezewood/Greenbrooke neighborhood
- **Hunters Ridge** - a section of Hunters Ridge Lane in the Hunters Ridge neighborhood
- **Avondale Court** - entry from Yellowstone Drive and cul-de-sac located in the Brentwood neighborhood

We anticipate these projects starting as soon as all final engineering has been completed. Signage will be placed to advise any change in traffic pattern. We ask your patience as we make these infrastructure/ road improvements. Our website and Facebook page will continue to provide the most current information. PUBLIC SERVICES

Our Service team is committed to providing the services most important to you, our residents, in the most efficient, cost-effective manner. We maintain the highest safety standards and continually train to ensure we are using equipment and resources in the most responsible manner.

We maintain a robust leaf collection program. In 2022, the Township, like most other communities, experienced difficulties with this program. There were considerable delays in service mainly caused by weather and labor shortages. Director Williams requested, and the Board approved the purchase of a self-contained leaf collection system so this valuable service will be handled in-house, not outsourced. This equipment will allow the Service Department to provide higher quality and more responsive service. This equipment was purchased with community cost share funds through Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District.

Nearly 700 households took advantage of our branch chipping program in 2022. We collected and disposed of 400 cubic yards of branches through this popular program.

Our recycling services are second to none! We offer two opportunities monthly to drop off household hazardous waste and the 1st Saturday of the month April thru November are Bulk Drop Off Days. It's the perfect chance to clean out the basement, garage, or shed and drop everything off at one time.



We recently purchased a New Holland/Alamo Machete Boom Mower. This versatile equipment will allow us to clean roadside ditches as part of our stormwater maintenance plan and clear hard-to-reach, often inaccessible trees, and brush. Prudent planning and spending on the part of our Department of Public Service allowed us to purchase this equipment with General Fund/Operating levy money with no financing of any kind.

INSTALLATION OF FIRE CHIEF METHVIN



The Board of Trustees would like to invite you to the installation of Fire Chief Chris Methvin on Wednesday, April 26th at 7:00pm in the Township Community Room. Passing the torch is always a moment to assess the past and look to the future with its challenges and opportunities. Chief Methvin served as the Township Assistant Fire Chief for about four years and comes with a

wealth of experience in both fire and emergency medical service. Chief Methvin completed the National Fire Academy Executive Officer program, earned a Master's Degree in Public Administration from Kent State University, and a Bachelor's Degree in Emergency Services Management.

Chris' appointment provides the opportunity for a smooth transition during a very busy time. The Department received a SAFER grant award which will allow us to hire three additional firefighter/EMTs to serve our residents and business community.

A three-year contract was also negotiated to ensure we retain/recruit and value our staff's commitment to their service mission. Chief Methvin is committed to excellence in service and has a vision for the Department in the coming months and years.

Chief Methvin is originally from Louisiana and served in Richmond VA and Hudson OH before coming to Olmsted Township. He also volunteers on the ski patrol in Snowshoe Mountain WV when he takes time for brief vacations. Chris is married to Laura and they have a son, Max.

We hope you will join us for the installation and "meet and greet" to welcome Chief Methvin into this new position.
